

GOOD NEWS: From Piercing Pain?

How can "good news" come from the piercing suffering pain willingly endured by Jesus? Three denials and cruel accusations hurled at Him. Agony from a crown of thorns, tortured, beaten, a whip flogged His back, nails penetrated His wrists and ankles, public humiliation, forced to carry His own cross, a grotesque execution, and spiritual pain caused by separation from His Father. How could the witnessing disciples and women not be speechless and afraid (Mark 16:5)?

Yet, After a great earthquake

the angel rolled the stone away. The courageous women could see inside, an empty tomb. He said, "Don't be afraid. He is not here: for He has risen Come, see..."

Saints, there's reason for joy, it's **good news**. Jesus who was crucified is risen!" How great is the resurrection to renew, revive, and refresh our hope in Jesus Christ. God shakes us to awareness, shakes our souls back to repentance.

to the quiet o Joseph Barsabbas

known as Justus, was a contender to replace Judas Iscariot as an apostle. God, by method of the disciples drawing lots, chose Matthias instead. Joseph, is mentioned in Acts 1 and then disappears. We know he was a disciple "who had heen with the Lord from the heainning of His ministry. He witnessed the resurrection. These are pretty astounding credentials. But Matthias was chosen. What happen? Did Joseph get bitter or resentful: question the decision, stew or hang his head in shame saying, "Life just isn't fair?" Was he envious of Matthias? All of us can relate to disappointment, personal rejection that still stings. It's God who ultimately opens and closes doors. Joseph with no shame said, "let's keep serving God in whatever door He opens and trust that He knows best when a door is closed." For this positive "no shame" attitude he became Bishop over ancient "Beth Gabra" later renamed Eleutheropolis, known as the "City of the Free." The Roman Emperor granted it municipal status, exempted its citizens from taxes—thus the name "City of the Free." The City flourished. Joseph (the one not chosen) became Bishop over an administrative hub region. Look at God!

PONDER THIS IMAGE! There is no shame after we are made holy! In Jesus we can change from an autopilot shameful mind and get divine power to demolish strongholds. Jesus frees us so we can change our lives and find God's new purpose.
