THINK IMAGE: "BALM IN GILEAD"

The Balm is a high-quality ointment with healing properties, taken from flowering plants growing in Gilead. The city, a prominent biblical place located east of the Jordan River: is well known for its spices and ointments. Judges: Jair, Jephthah; King Jehu, and the prophet Elijah, were all from Gilead. Many Bible events happened in Gilead. (See Gen. 31:20-23, 25, 32:1, 37:25; Deut. 3:13-15, 34:1-4; Num. 32-40; Judg. 20:1; 2 Sam. 17:24-26; Jer. 8:22, 46:11).

The Metaphor: Jeremiah, in a dark place, discouraged and mourning for his people, cries out: "Is there no balm in Gilead? Is there no physician there? Why then has not the health of my poor people been restored?" He is searching his soul; he is actually saying, "there must be a balm in Gilead," for he has found it as the sure foundation of his own Ponder This Image! There is a balm here. We can affirm God's presence and healing in the midst of this world. Our hope, trust, and faith is surly grounded in a God whom revives our souls again. and again.

The Old African-American Spiritual:

This **Spiritual** compares the healing balm to the saving power of Jesus — the one true treatment that never fails to heal our spiritual wounds. The Refrains: "There Is A Balm In Gilead" 1), There is a balm in Gilead to make the wounded whole; there is a balm in Gilead to heal the sin-sick soul. Sometimes I feel discouraged, and think my work's in vain. But then the Holy Spirit revives my soul again. 2). Don't ever

feel discouraged, for Jesus is your friend, and if you look for knowledge, he'll n'er refuse to lend. 3). If you can't preach like Peter, if you can't pray like Paul, just tell the love of Jesus, and say he died for all. H. Thurman, grandson of a slave (and noted theologian), says this spiritual's insight is, "optimism, that grows out of the pessimism of life and transcends it."
