"Getting What We Needed! It seems that after wondering aimlessly in the blindness of this world, to eventually, be made able to see God's plans for us; we have to acknowledge that what we really needed (some still do): "is to stand firmly and safely in God's favor (grace)."

Paul's dramatic, spiritual conversion was probably unexpected. His prior, comfortable, achieved lifestyle, was actually made blind to him. He physically could not see because of a flashing light from heaven and had to be lead around by others. Jesus' words: "Saul, Saul, why do you persecute me?" (Acts 9:4 NIV) is what he needed to later say, after grace, "for necessity is laid upon me; woe is unto me, if I preach not the gospe!" (1 Cor. 9:16b KJV).

Charles Harrison Mason, after water baptism and an Azusa Street Holy Ghost Filling, also had an unexpected dramatic, spiritual experience. In his tribulations, by patience and hope Jesus spoke, "Preach Holiness, build the church of God, and name it the Church Of God In Christ," [if you do] "there will never be a building large enough to hold the people coming to hear you preach." 


Feature Article


