- **3). PROVIDENCE AND PROPHECY**: is sustaining. God plans and prepares for the coming future. God in His providence foresees the future, and so in a mysterious way anticipates, prepares for it and guides it. Therefore, we can trust God's providence in all the events and circumstances of our lives. By providence and prophecy God still prepares the way for the Son! - **4). GOD IS ANSWERING THE CALL TO DELIVER**: We don't get to decide how God will deliver! We must believe that Christ will sustain the delivered.

- THE REALITY: 1). Sustaining means to strenothen, support physically, mentally and spiritually. 2). To undergo, suffer something unpleasant, such as injury and disease.
- SUSTAINING: Is keeping it going. We sustain a conversation because we keep it going. Also beans and rafters hold up a roof or sustain it.
- THE EQUIVALENT: of sustaining, ("to keep up" or "to take care of"), is maintain. Maintain applies only if what is needed to be kept needs a periodic or occasional activity. Sustaining and Maintaining are different!
- PERSONAL QUESTIONS: For church folks are: Have I sighed, "I'm no longer able to sustain hope? Is my character too weak to sustain my faith, trust, calling, or my actions? What's the point, there's never enough people, supplies, or money to sustain all these changes?
- HOLD on SAINTS: sustaining at a certain level means hearing/reading STUFF that inspire certainty as well as hope.

Bishop Nathaniel Bullock, teaches, good church leaders must lead (1 Cor. 11:1 KJV), be "out front," "no missing activities," be a "servant, not the one being served" give "clear directions," have a clear understanding of where one is leading, live as an "example of holiness" rather than only talk-

ing Sanctification.

He or she should "be progressive in the way of having the ability to persuade, convince, influence and inspire. Great leaders get pass their faults, are confident, able to accept comments from wise men and women around them. Some **Tips For Leaders**: They pray daily, fervently; give the most financially and spiritually; must walk, talk, be touchable, sincere, sensitive, live a life that's an open book, and be a worthy example for others to follow.

- Appreciate each other.
- Extend vourself.
- •Volunteer to do work.
- •Challenge each other to do better.
- •Back each other when things get tough. God is our Father, He is not distant, aloof, or impersonal, but longs for the depth of a Father-child relationship with saints as He has with Jesus who sustain everything.

THINK IMAGE: "What is Social Justice?" Social Justice is often used as a catchphrase for illegitimate forms of government promoting the redistribution of wealth and expansion of civil government. This view of it is a denial of authentic justice. Biblical Justice seeks to protect individual liberty while promoting personal responsibility. It is the equitable and impartial application of the rule of God's moral law in society. There is no clear and right definition of justice that excludes God. (C Deuteronomy 1:17, 32:4; James 4:12; Psalm 19:7-9).

JUSTICE AND FREEDOM: Contrary to some human feelings, the aim of Biblical justice is freedom. Freedom is defined as a release from illegitimate bondage in order to make the choice to exercise responsibility in actualizing and maximizing all that we were created to be. Biblical iustice encourages freedom through affirming accountability, equality and responsibility by linking the spiritual to the social realm. (C 2 Cor. 1:3-5: Matt. 5:4: Is. 53:3).

LIVE FEARLESSLY: Be courageous to face any tragedy calmly; with determination and without fear. We're not a <u>fearful people</u>. (1 Cor. 15:1-4: Phil. 2:12-13: Luke. 24:44-47).

Talk Is Cheap! Righteousness and justice are foundations of God's throne. Together they become an action of applying God's moral standards toward each other. We can't just talk about justice; we must do it. (C Ps. 89:14; Is. 1:17; Gal. 6:10; Jer. 22:3: Micah 6.8)
