"WALLS:" have the ability to prevent access. Think about it, something that is standing still has so much power to prevent people from entering into a next room, next part or phase. When renovating we can find **"one too many"** walls in a particular area. We might ask for a wall to be torn down because we envision more space and light. We can see the potential **but** there is something standing in the way. [[C Nehemiah 7:5 EASY](#)].

AS it is in the NATURAL, So it is in the SPIRITUAL!" Who is responsible for our walls in life? **Answer:** the one who puts up the wall. We are God's builders of our lives and we decide what walls we are going to put up. We even determine what walls we need to tear down by the direction of the Word of God and the discernment of the Holy Ghost. [[C Nehemiah 7:1-2 KJV; 8:1 HCSB](#)].

SOME WALLS PROTECT: us from the enemy. They control our interaction and defend us from attacks of the adversary. When others try to frighten us or stand in our way during the course of our building project, we must make no effort to entertain what is said or done. [[C Nehemiah 7:3-4 AMP](#)].

SOME DISTRACTIONS: come from voices that are surrounding us, even in our churches. Many voices can impede us from fulfilling our assignments. We do not have to allow impeding walls to effect us. Nehemiah didn't allow voices to deter his building. He ignored distracting voices, yet he responded in a way to protect his character. According to scripture, Nehemiah continued building the wall. He did not come down from his assignment. Even when the rumors began to spread regarding his position with the king, Tobiah, Sandballat, and Geshem were his enemies. The enemy's distractions, intimidation was not successful. [[C Mathew 3:6-7 NIV](#)].

SOME WALLS MUST BE COMPLETED! It is important and necessary that as we build whatever we have been called to build, we must remain solid and stable in what we believe. If we are not praying diligently and standing strong in our faith, unnecessary created walls will become strongholds. Strongholds that have been fortified by the enemy are difficult to pull down. [[C Deuteronomy 32: 4](#)].

STOP WRESTLING: Between the process and the promise, the journey and the manifestation. We all must desire access to the miraculous things that God has waiting for us. Do not stop the assignment. Whatever we do, let's keep building! [[C Nehemiah 8:8, NLT 62:2](#)].
