a person is to make him holy.

For the months in **2022**, James Davis E.M.L. DOOR POST Newsletters, will look deeply into "HOLINESS!" That being said, February's J.D.E.M.L. DOOR POST discusses "SANCTIFICATION!"

THE SURE FOUNDATIONAL: beliefs of the CHURCH OF GOD IN CHRIST (C.O.G.I.C.) focuses on holiness. The Bible defines holiness in two ways. One, as God's treatment. It is the basis of "hagiasmos" the Greek word for holiness, consecration, and sanctification. Other Greek words beginning with the root "hag," is the action to treat as holy, to purify; and followers of God are delivered to be holy saints. Two, God exists in the realm of the holy, rather than the profane, and all that pertains to Him must come into that same realm of holiness. This involve time, space, objects, and people.

**SANCTIFICATION:** The root idea is to stand in awe of something or someone. The Hebrew translation of "qadosh," triggers a meaning of being in **contrast** with the profane. This thought focuses on (qadosh) the holiness is <u>upon</u> God. His **name** is holy, and must not be profaned. "Let them praise thy great and terrible name; for it is holy" and "Wherewithal shall a young man cleanse his way? by taking heed thereto according to thy word" [C Ps. 99:3, 119:9 KJV]. God also promises, "I will set My face against that man, and will cut him off from his people, because he has given some of his descendants to Molech, to defile My sanctuary and profane My holy name" [C Lev. 20:3 NKJV].

TIMES, LANDS, OBJECTS AND HUMANS, GOD SEPARATES: Certain times HE sanctifies in that they are set apart especially for the Lord, like the Sabbath [C Gen. 2:3] or various events [C Lev. 23:4-44, 25:12 NKJV]. Just as our worship convocations and prayer revivals are today, by strictly observing the regulations governing these times, each holy saint sanctifies [treats as holy] these special events. Jerusalem, tabernacles, temples, and all the objects related to them He sanctifies. Gifts God sanctifies: those inherited, those who are required and those who are voluntary.

**SANCTIFICATION**: of people He closely identifies with the Law of Holiness [C Lev. 17-26] which includes ritual and ethical commands. Holiness is a responsibility of being holy in conduct [C Is. 5; Jer. 5-7]. ACT HOLY!

THINK IMAGE: **SANCTIFICATION!** RITUAL COMMAND and ETHICAL RESPONSIBILITY.

FEATURE ARTICAL

RITUAL COMMAND: is to accept the Holy Ghost's power of obedience. The action is the sprinkling of the blood of Jesus. Today this means believing in the cross and what it does for us.

"Peter, an apostle of Jesus Christ, ... Elect according to the foreknowledge of God the Father, in sanctification of the Spirit, for obedience and sprinkling of the blood of Jesus Christ: Grace ...peace, be multiplied" [C 1 Peter 1: 1-2 NKJV].

ETHICAL RESPONSIBILITY: of sanctification is to be pursued as an essential aspect of the believer's Life. The blood of sanctification must not be defiled by sinful conduct. Paul stresses both the individual's commitments to holy living and the enabling power of God for it (Heb. 12:14. 10:26-31, 11:16; 1 Thess. 3:13, 4:8; 2 Cor. 7:1 HCSB].

### PONDER THIS IMAGE:

The summation of the ethical imperative is seen in Peter's use of "Be holy because I am holy." Live Holy by Sanctification!
